

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




Students who considered teaching but chose something else did so based on other personal interests and a belief that teacher salaries could not support their desired standard of living.




Nearly half of students said starting salaries between \$70,000 and \$80,000 would entice them to become teachers.



What is the lowest salary that would entice you to become a teacher. (Options were presented as "Average starting salary of ____ per year")




Students prioritize their own interests and abilities as well as opportunities to make a difference and career options when choosing a field of study.


Students place high priority on a wide array of values, ranking personal relationships and financial stability highest by a small margin.






Most students plan to be in the same career field, if not the same career, 5 to 7 years after graduation from college, or to have gone to graduate school to advance in that career.




Most teaching majors plan to be teaching 5 to 7 years after graduation, but a higher percentage say they plan to leave to raise a family than students in other programs.





Which of the following best matches your expectations and plans for your career 5-7 years after graduation?


Most education majors decided to pursue teaching in high school or college.



When did you decide to become a teacher?




Students believe they are generally familiar with potential salary in their career field, but significantly less knowledgeable about potential health and retirement benefits.
